Fredericksburg by the Numbers

- 63,180 2015 average monthly ridership on all modes of transit
- 714,189 2016 passenger trips on all modes of transit
- \$5.2 million to operate public transportation and commuter services
- \$813,722 to purchase seven vehicles for commuter programs and human services
- \$8 million to expand Virginia Railway Express' Crossroads Yard and Maintenance Facility in Spotsylvania
- \$30 million to support freight rail in Fredericksburg and other districts

Projects of Note

- The Atlantic Gateway Project will extend I-95 express lanes about 10 miles south toward Fredericksburg and improve the Long Bridge, which is critical to the Virginia Railway Express' continued success.
- The DC2RVA project will bring high speed rail to the D.C. to Richmond corridor.
